**THIS DATE IN SJ GIANTS HISTORY**

**April 9, 1988** The San Jose Giants win their first game in franchise history, defeating the Fresno Suns by a 2-0 score. Eric Gunderson hurls a complete-game limiting the Suns to two hits while striking out 10.

**Opening Night...** The San Jose Giants open the 2009 regular season this evening when they host the Stockton Ports at Municipal Stadium. San Jose begins the campaign with seven consecutive home games against Stockton and the Bakersfield Blaze.

**2008 Review...** The Giants posted the top overall record in the California League last year when they finished with an 85-55 mark. San Jose won both the first half and second half Northern Division titles for the first time since 2001. The Giants led the California League in ERA for the fourth straight season while they were tied for second in batting average and first in fielding percentage. San Jose earned a bye through the first round of the playoffs before falling to Stockton, three-games-to-two, in the Northern Division Series.

**Prospect Bonanza...** According to *Baseball America*, the top five prospects in the San Francisco farm system and six out of the top seven (#1 Madison Bumgarner, #2 Buster Posey, #3 Angel Villalona, #4 Tim Alderson, #5 Nick Noonan, #7 Conor Gillaspie) are on San Jose's opening day roster.

**First Round Picks...** Six former first round draft picks headline San Jose's roster with catcher Buster Posey and third baseman Conor Gillaspie chosen in the opening round last year. Pitchers Tim Alderson and Madison Bumgarner along with second baseman Nick Noonan were selected in the 2007 first round while pitcher Craig Whitaker was a 2003 first round draftee.

**Andy Skeels...** The San Jose Giants welcome a new manager this season as Andy Skeels begins his first year at the helm. Skeels spent last season managing the Augusta GreenJackets (Low-A) to the South Atlantic League championship and the best record (88-50) among full-season teams in all of Minor League Baseball. Previously, Skeels served two seasons (2006-07) as Augusta's hitting instructor while his other coaching experience includes four years in the Montreal Expos organization and one season each in the Texas Rangers and Los Angeles Dodgers minor league systems. Skeels was originally drafted by the San Diego Padres in 1987 and spent 12 years as a minor league catcher in the Padres, Dodgers and New York Yankees organizations, including stints in the California League with the Riverside Red Wave (1988-89), Salinas Spurs (1992) and Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (1993).

**The Posey File...** Catcher Buster Posey returns to San Jose to open the 2009 season after spending last year's playoffs with the Giants. Posey won every major college Player of the Year award last year at Florida State University before he was selected fifth overall in the 2008 draft. The backstop has only 15 games of professional experience (including five post-season games with San Jose last September), but shined in the Hawaii Winter League (.338 AVG) after the conclusion of the minor league season and then hit .300 with two home runs in 30 at-bats during major league spring training camp.

**Media Coverage...** The San Jose Giants and Comcast have joined forces to bring fans 14 live television broadcasts during the 2009 season. The games can be viewed live on Comcast Hometown Network Channel 104 throughout most Northern California regions and anytime through Comcast On Demand Channel 1. The broadcast schedule includes tonight's game against Stockton as well as 10 other home games and three road games. Additionally, all 140 games this season can be heard live on www.sjgiants.com.

**Today's Opponent: Stockton Ports...** The Stockton Ports, an affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, open their 2009 regular season this evening against the Giants. Stockton won the California League title last year after defeating the Lancaster JetHawks three-games-to-one in the Championship Series. 11 players from last season's championship squad have returned to Stockton. Aaron Nieckula is in his first season as manager of the Ports after serving three years at the helm for Kane County (Low-A) and compiling a 214-202 record. Outfielder Matt Spencer is expected to play a leading role offensively after batting .333 with eight homers and 27 RBI's with the Ports last year.

Led the California League in earned run average ... Also finished tied for third in victories and fourth in strikeouts ... Amassed 124 strikeouts and walked just 34 over 145 1/3 innings pitched ... Shared the San Jose Giants Pitcher of the Year award with Kevin Pucetas ... Was 7-1 with a 2.18 ERA in 11 starts after the All-Star break ... Showed remarkable consistency throughout the year allowing three runs or fewer in 22 out of his 26 starts and had 13 starts in which he surrendered one or no runs ... Allowed only four home runs throughout the entire season ... Walked just one batter over his last 37 regular season innings and held the opposition to a paltry .163 batting average with runners in scoring position ...

**2007...** Pitched for the ARL-Giants (Rookie) and did not allow a run over five innings ... Struck out 12 and did not walk a batter.

**PERSONAL...** Attended Horizon High School (Scottsdale, AZ) and won a pair of state championships ... Two-time Arizona High School Player of the Year ... Struck out 111 batters compared to just five walks in 72 innings during his final high school season ... Logged a 12-0 record, 1.07 ERA and two saves to earn First Team All-American honors.
