Giants Begin Three-Game Series Against High Desert Tonight... The San Jose Giants continue their homestand this evening with the opener of a three-game series against the High Desert Mavericks at Municipal Stadium. San Jose won two out of three games from the visiting Modesto Nuts in their most recent series, claiming the last two contests by the combined score of 20-4. Modesto edged the Giants 5-4 on Saturday before San Jose bounced back with an 11-1 win on Sunday and a 9-3 victory last night. Shane Jordan and Buster Posey both knocked out three hits while Darren Ford drove home three runs to lead the offensive attack in the rubber match. Craig Clark earned his eighth win of the season after working five innings with three runs allowed and eight strikeouts. The Giants scored nine unanswered runs to finish the game erasing an early deficit.

San Jose Stretches Series Win Streak To Nine... The Giants have now won their last nine series dating back to the first week of June. San Jose's last series loss came in a four-game set at Visalia from May 27-30. The Giants then split a four-game series with Stockton (May 31-June 3) before starting the current run. Despite the hot streak, San Jose has continued to struggle in series openers having posted a 4-5 record during the active streak (11-13 overall).

Versus The South... This series marks San Jose's first games against a Southern Division opponent since May 19-21 when they hosted the Inland Empire 66ers in a three-game set. The Giants are just 6-7 against the South Division (3-3 at home) this season. They have yet to play the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in addition to not having been to Inland Empire or Lake Elsinore this year. San Jose has dominated against the North Division having posted a 45-24 (.652) record.

Pitching Leaders... The Giants are bidding to lead the California League in ERA for the sixth consecutive season as their 3.32 team earned run average is currently lowest among all teams. San Jose also boasts three out of the top eight pitchers individually in ERA: Craig Clark (4th – 3.12), Scott Barnes (5th – 3.16) and Clayton Tanner (8th – 3.57).

Kieschnick's Power Surge... Right fielder Roger Kieschnick is in the midst of a power surge at the plate as the California League All-Star has blasted 10 home runs and has 33 RBI's in his last 25 games. He's currently third in the league in RBI's (62) and fifth in home runs (16) to go with a .300 batting average.

Tough To Beat At Home... The Giants enter tonight's game with a 13-2 record in their last 15 home games. San Jose's 28-13 mark at Municipal Stadium this season is the best home record in the California League. The Giants hit .284 as a team at home (.263 on the road) while they boast a 2.80 ERA (3.87 on the road).

Bullpen Excellence... The Giants bullpen owns a sparkling 0.88 ERA (9 ER/92.1 IP) in the last 30 games (23-7 record) beginning with their contest on June 3. The San Jose bullpen allowed 11 runs in their 16-7 loss at Stockton on June 2 before the current run. Dan Runzler boasts a perfect 0.00 ERA (10.0 IP) since joining the club on June 8 from Augusta while fellow left-hander Wilmin Rodriguez has gone 12 straight appearances without allowing a run (12 IP). Steve Edlefsen has surrendered just three hits and no runs over his last 11 innings of relief spanning nine outings and David Mixon has not yielded a run over his last nine appearances (14 2/3 IP). Meanwhile, Daniel Turpen has been impressive all season with a 1.40 ERA in 28 games.

San Jose Wins League Record Fifth Consecutive First Half Title... The Giants won their fifth consecutive first half North Division title last month, despite sitting in sole possession of the top spot for only three out of 74 days (the final three days). San Jose finished the half with a 42-28 record – two games ahead of the Modesto Nuts (40-30) and three games in front of the Visalia Rawhide (39-31). The Giants are the first team in California League history to win five consecutive first half titles. San Jose achieved the new record last year with their fourth straight division crown. By virtue of winning the first half, the Giants reach the playoffs for the sixth consecutive season while they also earn a first round bye. San Jose opens the post-season on Saturday, September 12 at Municipal Stadium with Game One of the best-of-five North Division Series.

Media Coverage... Tonight's can be heard live on www.sjgiants.com with Joe Ritzo and Rocky Koplik calling all of the action. All 140 games this season will be aired on the club's official website.

Today's Opponent: High Desert Mavericks... The High Desert Mavericks, an affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, enter tonight's match-up with a 51-31 overall record and an 8-4 mark in the second half – tops in the South Division. High Desert won the first half South Division title this season for the first time since 1993. The Mavericks currently lead the California League in batting average (.304), runs scored (6.6 per game) and home runs (108). Their team ERA of 5.01 is second-worst. Individually, outfielder Jamie McOwen brings a remarkable 43-game hitting streak into this evening's game – a California League record. The hitting streak matches the longest in minor league baseball in 55 years. He is second in the league with a .354 batting average trailing only teammate Alex Liddi (.356).

2009 SEASON... Tied for fourth in the California League with eight victories and fifth in ERA (3.16) ... Is 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 ER/24.2 IP) in his past four starts ... Has not allowed an earned run in his last two starts (12 IP) – both against Stockton ... Tossed six shutout innings in his most recent appearance on July 2 to earn the win ... Struck out eight, walked two and allowed just five hits ... Received a no-decision on June 26 versus the Ports despite striking out a season-high 10 over six innings ... Walked none and surrendered two unearned runs ... Has struck out 42 in his last five starts spanning 28 2/3 innings ... Had to make six consecutive starts on the road from April 17 through May 16, but compiled a 3-1 record during the span ... Only previous appearance against High Desert was on April 23 ... Recorded the win after firing five innings with two runs allowed and five strikeouts ... Holding left-handed hitters to a .202 batting average (.235 vs. right-handers) ... Limiting the opposition to a .214 batting average (12-for-56) with runners in scoring position ... Compiled a 3.86 ERA in April, a 4.05 ERA in May before a 2.38 ERA in four June starts ... Has allowed three runs or fewer in his last nine starts.

CAREER... 21-year old left-hander is in his second professional season ... Rated the #9 prospect in the San Francisco Giants organization according to *Baseball America* prior to the 2009 season ... Also considered to have the "best change-up" of any pitcher in the farm system by *Baseball America* ... Originally a 43rd round selection by the Washington Nationals in the 2005 Draft, but instead elected to attend St. John's University.

2008... Pitched briefly for the ARL-Giants (Rookie) and Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) before joining Augusta (Low-A) in late-July ... Starred with GreenJackets compiling a 3-2 record and a 1.38 ERA in six starts ... Struck out 41 batters and walked only seven over 32 2/3 innings pitched ... Also won both of his post-season starts after allowing only two runs in 13 innings ... Appeared in two games with the Volcanoes (4.76 ERA) after three appearances with the ARL-Giants (3.38 ERA).

PERSONAL... Attended St. John's University ... Named to the Big East Conference First Team in 2007 and 2008 ... Notched a 7-3 record and a 3.69 ERA with 90 strikeouts in 90 1/3 innings during final collegiate season ... Ranks third on school's career strikeout list with 263 ... Attended Chicopee (Mass.) High School ... Earned league Pitcher of the Year and Player of the Year honors as a senior after posting a 9-0 record with a 0.13 ERA and 120 strikeouts while also hitting .588 with six home runs.
