**Giants Begin Six-Game Homestand Tonight Against Rancho Cucamonga...** The San Jose Giants begin a six-game homestand this evening with the first of three straight contests against the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes at Municipal Stadium. San Jose just completed a stretch of six consecutive games against the Stockton Ports, winning twice. The Giants took two out of three games from the visiting Ports in a series earlier in the week before Stockton swept a three-game set at Banner Island Ballpark. The Ports completed the sweep with a 4-3 victory last night taking advantage of four San Jose errors, which led to three unearned runs. Clayton Tanner suffered the tough-luck loss on the mound surrendering just one earned run over six innings of work. It marked the first time this season that the Giants have been swept in a series.

**San Jose Looking To Tie Record For Best Month In Team History...** San Jose boasts an outstanding 21-8 record in July and needs a victory tonight to match the winningest month in team history (1988-2009). The 1998 and 2005 clubs both won 22 games in May. The '98 squad posted a 22-7 record while the '05 team was 22-9. Both teams would eventually win California League championships.

**Rancho Who?...** Prior to tonight, Rancho Cucamonga had been the only team the Giants had not played this season. The Giants though won't have to wait long to see the Quakes again as they'll play a three-game series at The Epicenter starting next Friday, August 7. San Jose is 9-7 against the South Division this season (6-3 at Municipal Stadium).

**Giants Try To Avoid First Four-Game Losing Streak...** The Giants need a win this evening to avoid their first four-game losing streak of the season. Their only previous three-game slide was from May 20-22.

**Dynamic Duo...** Outfielders Thomas Neal and Roger Kieschnick have formed a potent 1-2 punch in the middle of the Giants lineup with the duo both ranking among the league leaders in several offensive categories. Neal leads the California League in batting average (.351) and doubles (36) while he's second in slugging percentage (.618) and fourth in runs scored (79) and on-base percentage (.437). Kieschnick is tied for the league-lead with 85 RBI's and is tied for third in home runs (21) to go with a .292 batting average. Kieschnick is one home run away from cracking San Jose's Top 5 single-season home run list while his 85 RBI's rank tied for fourth in minor league baseball (nine behind the leader).

**Third-Best Record In Minor League Baseball...** San Jose (68-37, .648) currently owns the third-best overall record among full-season teams in all of minor league baseball. The Giants trail only the Low-A Fort Wayne TinCaps (72-31, .699) and the Double-A Birmingham Barons (68-35, .660).

**Second Half Report...** The Giants possess a 26-9 record at the midpoint of the second half – six games ahead of the Stockton Ports (20-15) for the top spot in the North Division. Four regulars are batting over .300 since the All-Star break: Thomas Neal (.368), C.J. Ziegler (.367), Darren Ford (.331) and Brian Bocock (.308) while Roger Kieschnick has nine homers and 36 RBI's in 32 games.

**League-Leading Pitching Staff...** The Giants enter tonight's game first in the California League in team ERA (3.21). San Jose is attempting to lead the league in pitching for the sixth consecutive season while they currently boast two out of the top six hurlers individually in ERA: Craig Clark (T3rd – 2.85) and Clayton Tanner (6th – 3.18).

**Giants Series Unbeaten Streak Ends At 16...** The sweep in Stockton for the Giants marked San Jose's first series loss since they dropped three out of four games at Visalia from May 27-30. The Giants had enjoyed a 16-series unbeaten streak earning 14 series wins and two splits during the hot streak.

**Hitting In The Clutch...** The Giants are hitting .295 as a team with runners in scoring position. Individually, C.J. Ziegler (.381), Darren Ford (.333), Brian Bocock (.329), Tyler Graham (.328), David Maroul (.318), Thomas Neal (.308) and Roger Kieschnick (.300) are all hitting above the .300 mark.

**Media Coverage...** Tonight's game will be televised live on Comcast Hometown Network Channel 104 with Joe Ritzo and Rocky Koplik handling the play-by-play and color commentary duties respectively. The game can also be heard live on www.sjgiants.com with Ben Guerrero describing all of the action.

**Today's Opponent: Rancho Cucamonga Quakes...** The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes, an affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim, enter tonight's match-up with a 47-58 overall record and a 17-18 mark in the second half – two games out of first place. The Quakes are sixth in the California League in batting average (.265) and ERA (4.53) while they're ninth in home runs (57) and first in stolen bases (121).

**2009 SEASON...** Scheduled to make his 10th start with the Giants in this evening's game ... Received a no-decision in his last appearance on July 26 versus Stockton ... Pitched six innings and allowed three runs (all earned) on nine hits with no walk and four strikeouts ... All three runs scored in the first inning ... Is winless in his last three starts (0-1) ... Last victory came on July 10 at Visalia (6 IP, 3 R) ... Has pitched exactly six innings in each of his last five starts ... Holding the opposition to a .200 batting average (9-for-45) with runners in scoring position ... Began the year in Extended Spring Training before joining the Augusta GreenJackets (Low-A) on May 20 ... Made three starts with Augusta and compiled a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) and a 1-1 record ... Struck out a career-high 10 over seven innings versus Asheville on May 27 ... Faced Tom Glavine in June 2 start and opposed John Smoltz in May 21 appearance ... Added to San Jose's roster on June 8.

**CAREER...** Left-handed pitcher is in his fourth season in the San Francisco organization and second campaign with the San Jose Giants ... Has been a part of two league championship teams (San Jose 2007, Salem-Keizer 2006) ... Owns a career record of 18-14 and a 3.83 ERA over 74 appearances (46 starts) ... Originally selected in the 47th round of the 2002 draft by the Texas Rangers, but did not sign.

**2008...** Spent the entire season with Connecticut (AA) and was 3-2 with a 4.58 ERA in 19 games (eight starts) ... Began the year in the Defenders starting rotation and was 1-2 with a 4.80 ERA in seven starts before moving to the bullpen ... Made just one start after June 17 ... Compiled a 3.68 ERA in 11 relief appearances (5.14 ERA in eight starts) ... Struck out 45 and walked 29 over 57 innings ... **2007...** Won San Jose's Pitcher of the Year award after compiling a 10-6 record and a 3.54 ERA in 27 appearances (26 starts) with the Giants ... Finished fourth in the California League in ERA and fifth in strikeouts ... Fanned 132 and issued just 35 walks in 157 2/3 innings ... Has a string of 12 consecutive starts from May 25 through July 27 with at least six innings pitched in each appearance ... Best month of the season was in July (2.31 ERA) ... Walked only four left-handed batters in 156 at-bats ... Started the opening game of the North Division Series and the Championship Series ... **2006...** Pitched exclusively out of the Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) bullpen ... Was 2-1 with a 3.72 ERA and two saves over 16 relief appearances ... Struck out 39 and walked only nine over 29 innings ... Did not allow a run in last eight outings (17 2/3 IP).

**PERSONAL...** Attended UCLA ... Enjoyed a standout final collegiate season in 2006 posting a 1.66 ERA in 48 2/3 innings over 29 relief appearances ... Compiled a 3-1 record with nine walks and 47 strikeouts ... Pitched in only six games as a redshirt sophomore in 2005 (1-0, 8.10 ERA) ... Did not pitch in first two years (2003 and 2004) due to various injuries ... Established school single-season and career records for strikeouts at La Costa Canyon High School, but was limited to DH duties as a senior due to an arm injury ... Underwent Tommy John Surgery on left elbow in addition to surgery to repair a torn labrum during amateur career... Selected as the top 16-year in the country in 2000 by *Baseball America*.
