Giants Begin Three-Game Series Against Visalia Tonight... The San Jose Giants continue their homestand this evening with the opener of a three-game series against the Visalia Rawhide at Municipal Stadium. San Jose won two out of three games from the visiting Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in their most recent series. The Giants posted victories of 7-2 and 2-0 in the first two contests before the Quakes earned a 5-3, 11-inning win in the series finale last Sunday. San Jose battled back with a pair of runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to tie the game, but Rancho Cucamonga took the lead for good by scoring twice in the top of the 11th. Starting pitcher Kyle Nicholson made his California League debut for the Giants and worked the first five innings with three runs (two earned) and nine hits allowed. Darren Ford led the offensive attack with a pair of hits, including his fourth home run of the season.

League-Leading Pitching Staff... The Giants enter tonight's game first in the California League with a 3.16 ERA while they've also issued the fewest walks (285) and tossed the most shutouts (10). San Jose is attempting to lead the league in pitching for the sixth consecutive season and they currently boast two out of the top six hurlers individually in ERA: Craig Clark (2nd, 2.68) and Clayton Tanner (6th, 3.18). Out of the bullpen, Dan Runzler has allowed just one earned run and six hits over 20 1/3 innings (0.44 ERA). Daniel Turpen (1.40 ERA) and Wilmin Rodriguez (1.90 ERA) have also been outstanding in relief all season over 35 and 38 appearances respectively.

Nine In A Row Over The Rawhide... San Jose has won their last nine games against the Visalia Rawhide dating back to June 16. The Giants have outscored the Rawhide by a whopping 77-14 margin during the win streak. San Jose won the last two games of a series from Visalia at Municipal Stadium during the final week of the first half before sweeping seven games at Recreation Park in July. Individually, Thomas Neal is batting at a .409 clip (27-for-66) with four home runs and 15 RBI's in 17 games versus the Rawhide. Before tonight, 14 out of the 17 games played between the teams were in Visalia.

The Ford File... Center fielder Darren Ford has turned around his season batting .341 in 135 at-bats during the second half after hitting at just a .207 clip over 140 at-bats before the All-Star break. Ford began switch-hitting last off-season, but gave it up during the All-Star break and is again batting exclusively from the right side. The 23-year old hit .173 in May and .189 in June before breaking out with a .352 batting average (37-for-105) in July. Ford has also hit safely in his last eight games and has stolen eight bases in his last seven contests.

Third-Best Record In Minor League Baseball... San Jose (70-38, .648) currently owns the third-best overall record among full-season teams in all of minor league baseball. The Giants trail only the Low-A Fort Wayne TinCaps (74-33, .692) and the Double-A Birmingham Barons (71-36, .664).

Dynamic Duo... Outfielders Thomas Neal and Roger Kieschnick have formed a potent 1-2 punch in the middle of the Giants lineup with the duo both ranking among the league leaders in several offensive categories. Neal is tied for first in the California League in batting average (.347) while he's first in doubles (36), fourth in on-base percentage (.431) and runs scored (81) and fifth in slugging percentage (.604). Kieschnick is second in the league with 87 RBI's and is tied for third in home runs (21) to go with a .290 batting average. Kieschnick is one home run away from cracking San Jose's Top 5 single-season home run list while his 87 RBI's rank fourth in minor league baseball (14 behind the leader).

Second Half Report... The Giants possess a 28-10 record in the second half – six games ahead of the Stockton Ports (22-16) for the top spot in the North Division. Three regulars are batting over .300 since the All-Star break: Thomas Neal (.355), Darren Ford (.341) and C.J. Ziegler (.314) while Roger Kieschnick has nine homers and 38 RBI's in 35 games.

Giants Match Team Record For Winningest Month... San Jose finished July with a 22-8 record to tie the team record for most wins in a month. The 1998 and 2005 clubs both won 22 games in May. The '98 squad posted a 22-7 record while the '05 team was 22-9. Both teams would eventually win California League championships.

Media Coverage... Tonight's game can be heard live on www.sjgiants.com with Joe Ritzo and Rocky Koplik calling all of the action. All 140 games this season will be aired live on the club's official website.

Today's Opponent: Visalia Rawhide... The Visalia Rawhide, an affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, enter tonight's match-up with a 52-56 overall record and a 13-25 mark in the second half. Visalia is currently one game ahead of Bakersfield (51-57) for the final playoff spot in the North Division. The Rawhide are last in the league in batting average (.241), runs scored (4.5 per game) and home runs (51), but are third in ERA (4.21) and tied for first in fielding percentage (.973). Visalia is just 5-12 against the Giants this season. Right-hander Trevor Harden is slated to start on the mound tonight. Harden is 0-3 with a 3.38 ERA (6 ER/16.0 IP) in three previous starts versus San Jose.

2009 SEASON... Sixth in the California League in ERA ... Suffered the loss in his last start on July 30 at Stockton ... Worked six innings and allowed two runs (one earned) on six hits ...
