Giants Begin Three-Game Series At Bakersfield Tonight... The San Jose Giants continue their road trip this evening with the opener of a three-game series against the Bakersfield Blaze at Sam Lynn Ballpark. San Jose claimed two out of three games from the host Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in their most recent series posting double-digit run totals in both of their victories (10-8 on Friday and 11-4 on Sunday). Thomas Neal and Tyler Graham both hit home runs in the series finale while Nestor Rojas added a pair of doubles and three RBI's. On the mound, Clayton Tanner earned the victory after working six innings and surrendering three runs on six hits.

Second Half Race... San Jose is attempting to win both halves in the North Division for the second consecutive season. Entering tonight, the Giants (32-12) own a five-game lead over the Stockton Ports (27-17) for the top spot in the North Division. Before last year, the last time a San Jose team won both halves was in 2001.

Winning Series... The Giants have won 17 out of their last 19 series' dating back to the first week of June. The only exceptions are a four-game series split at home against Modesto from July 15-18 and a three-game sweep at Stockton from July 28-30.

League-Leading Pitching Staff... The Giants enter tonight's game first in the California League with a 3.23 ERA while they've also issued the fewest walks (306) and tossed the most shutouts (10). San Jose is attempting to lead the league in pitching for the sixth consecutive season and they currently boast two out of the top four hurlers individually in ERA: Craig Clark (1st, 2.72) and Clayton Tanner (4th, 3.23).

Versus The Blaze... San Jose is 11-5 this season against the Bakersfield Blaze, including a 4-2 mark in games played at Sam Lynn Ballpark. The Giants have won two out of three games in each of their previous series' in Bakersfield (May 5-7, June 9-11). Individually, Tyler Graham has hit four out of his seven home runs this year against the Blaze while he's also a perfect 8-for-8 in stolen bases over 10 games. Thomas Neal owns the highest batting average versus Bakersfield at .373 (22-for-59) with eight doubles, four home runs and 11 RBI's in 15 games. San Jose has won their last five games against the Blaze.

Climbing The Charts... Several San Jose Giants players are moving up the charts in various statistical categories on the single-season team records lists. Roger Kieschnick's 21 home runs is sixth in San Jose's team history with Tim Flaherty (2001) holding the record with 26. Kieschnick (89) is also only six RBI's away from cracking the top 5 (Mark Leonard owns the team record with 118 RBI's in 1988). Thomas Neal has hit 37 doubles to move into a tie for fifth in Giants history in that department. Leonard's 50 doubles in 1988 is the all-time record. Neal (.339) also has a chance to set the team record for highest single-season batting average with Leonard and Todd Wilson (1997) setting the pace with identical .345 averages. On the pitching side, Craig Clark won his 14th game of the season last week – tied for the fifth-most in team history. Tom Meagher (1988) and Darin Blood (1996) hold the record with 17 wins apiece.

Third-Best Record In Minor League Baseball... San Jose (74-40, .649) currently owns the third-best overall record among full-season teams in all of minor league baseball. The Giants trail only the Low-A Fort Wayne TinCaps (77-37, .675) and the Double-A Birmingham Barons (76-38, .667).

Road Warriors... The start of the current road trip last Friday marked the beginning of a stretch where San Jose will play 19 out of their final 29 games on the road. Entering tonight, the Giants have still played the most home games of any team in the league (60). San Jose is a league-best 32-22 on the road this year.

Rare Blowout Loss... Saturday's 9-2 defeat at Rancho Cucamonga was only the fifth time through 114 games this season that the Giants lost by more than four runs. The six runs allowed in the bottom of the sixth was also the most runs surrendered in an inning by San Jose this year.

Minor League Leaders... Craig Clark is tied for second in minor league baseball with 14 wins while Roger Kieschnick is fifth in RBI's (88) and Thomas Neal is tied for fifth in doubles (37).

Today's Opponent: Bakersfield Blaze... The Bakersfield Blaze, an affiliate of the Texas Rangers, enter tonight's match-up with a 54-60 overall record and a 20-24 mark in the second half. Bakersfield is one game behind the Visalia Rawhide (55-59) for the final wild card spot in the North Division.

2009 SEASON... Scheduled to make his 12th start with the Giants in this evening's game ... Has matched a career-high with eight innings pitched in each of his last two starts ... Suffered the defeat on August 5 against Visalia despite allowing just one run on four hits ... Turned in one of the finest performances of his career on July 31 versus Rancho Cucamonga yielding just one hit (a bunt single) and one unearned run with nine strikeouts and no walks ... Tonight marks first road start since July 10 after five straight appearances at home ... Holding the opposition to a .192 batting average (10-for-52) with runners in scoring position ... Began the year in Extended Spring Training before joining the Augusta GreenJackets (Low-A) on May 20 ... Made three starts with Augusta and compiled a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) and a 1-1 record ... Struck out a career-high 10 over seven innings versus Asheville on May 27 ... Faced Tom Glavine in June 2 start and opposed John Smoltz in May 21 appearance ... Added to San Jose's roster on June 8.

CAREER... Left-handed pitcher is in his fourth season in the San Francisco organization and second campaign with the San Jose Giants ... Has been a part of two league championship teams (San Jose 2007, Salem-Keizer 2006) ... Owns a career record of 19-14 and a 3.74 ERA over 75 appearances (47 starts) ... Originally selected in the 47th round of the 2002 draft by the Texas Rangers, but did not sign.

2008... Spent the entire season with Connecticut (AA) and was 3-2 with a 4.58 ERA in 19 games (eight starts) ... Began the year in the Defenders starting rotation and was 1-2 with a 4.80 ERA in seven starts before moving to the bullpen ... Made just one start after June 17 ... Compiled a 3.68 ERA in 11 relief appearances (5.14 ERA in eight starts) ... Struck out 45 and walked 29 over 57 innings ... **2007...** Won San Jose's Pitcher of the Year award after compiling a 10-6 record and a 3.54 ERA in 27 appearances (26 starts) with the Giants ... Finished fourth in the California League in ERA and fifth in strikeouts ... Fanned 132 and issued just 35 walks in 157 2/3 innings ... Has a string of 12 consecutive starts from May 25 through July 27 with at least six innings pitched in each appearance ... Best month of the season was in July (2.31 ERA) ... Walked only four left-handed batters in 156 at-bats ... Started the opening game of the North Division Series and the Championship Series ... **2006...** Pitched exclusively out of the Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) bullpen ... Was 2-1 with a 3.72 ERA and two saves over 16 relief appearances ... Struck out 39 and walked only nine over 29 innings ... Did not allow a run in last eight outings (17 2/3 IP).

PERSONAL... Attended UCLA ... Enjoyed a standout final collegiate season in 2006 posting a 1.66 ERA in 48 2/3 innings over 29 relief appearances ... Compiled a 3-1 record with nine walks and 47 strikeouts ... Pitched in only six games as a redshirt sophomore in 2005 (1-0, 8.10 ERA) ... Did not pitch in first two years (2003 and 2004) due to various injuries ... Established school single-season and career records for strikeouts at La Costa Canyon High School, but was limited to DH duties as a senior due to an arm injury ... Underwent Tommy John Surgery on left elbow in addition to surgery to repair a torn labrum during amateur career... Selected as the top 16-year in the country in 2000 by *Baseball America*.
