Giants Begin Four-Game Series Against Lancaster Tonight... The San Jose Giants continue their final homestand of the regular season this evening with the opener of a four-game series against the Lancaster JetHawks at Municipal Stadium. San Jose won two out of three from the Visalia Rawhide in their most recent series taking the rubber game last night by a 4-2 score. Clayton Tanner limited the Rawhide to three hits and one run over seven innings to earn the victory on the mound while Thomas Neal led the offensive charge with a two-run homer in the first inning and an RBI single in the bottom of the fifth.

San Jose Secures Top Overall Record In Division, Homefield Advantage In Playoffs... Last night's victory guaranteed San Jose (83-46) will finish with the best overall record in the North Division thereby securing homefield advantage throughout the playoffs. The Giants will host Games One, Two and Five (if necessary) of the North Division Series. Should San Jose advance to the Championship Series, they would host Games Three, Four and Five as the North Division winner receives homefield advantage this season. The Giants have a six-game lead over the High Desert Mavericks (77-52) for the top overall record in the entire league. San Jose is attempting to finish with the best record in the California League for the second consecutive season and the fourth time in the last five years.

Magic Number At 3 To Clinch Second Half Title... San Jose is attempting to win both halves in the North Division for the second consecutive season. Entering tonight, the Giants (41-18) own a nine-game lead over the Bakersfield Blaze (32-27) and the Stockton Ports (32-27) for the top spot in the North Division with 11 games remaining in the regular season. San Jose's magic number (combination of Giants wins and/or Stockton/Bakersfield losses) to clinch the division crown is three. San Jose needs at least an 8-3 mark to end the year to break the team record for most wins in a half (1988, 48-24 record in second half).

Muni Success... The Giants own a remarkable 32-8 record in their last 40 home games dating back to June 5. San Jose has not lost a series at Municipal Stadium since dropping two out of three games to the Inland Empire 66ers from May 19-21. Overall, the Giants boast a league-best 47-19 home record. The pitching staff possesses a 2.69 ERA in games at home (as opposed to 4.09 on the road).

Kieschnick In The Record Book... Right fielder Roger Kieschnick continues to climb the charts in the single-season San Jose Giants record book. Kieschnick's 23 home runs this year is tied with Mike Glendenning (1999) for the third-most in Giants history. Tim Flaherty holds the top two spots with 26 homers in 2001 and 25 during the 1999 campaign. Additionally, Kieschnick has collected 101 RBI's this season – the fourth-highest mark in team history. The only other players that have amassed 100 RBI's in a single-season in San Jose Giants history: Mark Leonard (118, 1988), Rich Aldrete (108, 1988) and Sean McGowan (106, 2000).

Team Awards... The Giants will continue their end-of-season individual awards tonight when they honor their Relief Pitcher of the Year. San Jose has already recognized shortstop Brian Bocoek as their Defensive Player of the Year and infielder Skyler Stromsmoe as the Nette Rappe Good Guy Award winner during the homestand. The rest of the awards are as follows: Offensive Player of the Year (Friday), Pitcher of the Year (Saturday), Most Valuable Player (Sunday).

Neal To Play In Arizona Fall League... Rosters for the upcoming Arizona Fall League season were announced earlier this week with left fielder Thomas Neal the only current San Jose player selected by the organization to participate in the prestigious league. Neal is currently fifth in the California League with a .333 batting average to go with 39 doubles, 21 home runs and 83 RBI's. The other five players from the San Francisco organization chosen to play in the Arizona Fall League are all former San Jose Giants: catcher Buster Posey, shortstop Brandon Crawford and pitchers Steve Edlefsen, Joe Martinez and Dan Runzler. All six players will be suiting up for the Scottsdale Scorpions.

Third-Best Record In Minor League Baseball... San Jose (83-46, .643) currently owns the third-best overall record among full-season teams in all of minor league baseball. The Giants trail only the Low-A Fort Wayne TinCaps (87-42, .674) and the Double-A Birmingham Barons (84-45, .651).

Media Coverage... Tonight's game can be heard live on www.sjgiants.com with Joe Ritzo calling all of the action. All 140 games this season will be aired on the club's official website.

Today's Opponent: Lancaster JetHawks... The Lancaster JetHawks, an affiliate of the Houston Astros, enter tonight's match-up with a 53-76 overall record and a 27-32 mark in the second half. Lancaster trails the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (57-72) by four games for the final wild card spot in the South Division. The JetHawks won two out of three games against the Giants in Lancaster from April 27-29 in the only previous meeting between the teams. Lancaster is second in the league in batting average (.284), third in home runs (120) and last in ERA (5.89).

2009 SEASON... Scheduled to make his 15th start with the Giants in this evening's game ... Suffered the loss in his last appearance on August 22 at Stockton after allowing career-high totals of eight runs (all earned) and 10 hits over 4 2/3 innings ... Also walked a season-high four while striking out five ... Had allowed only one run in three out of his previous four starts ... Worked eight innings in back-to-back starts on July 31 and August 5 and yielded a total of just one earned run and five hits ... Has fared considerably better at home (2.92 ERA) as opposed to on the road (7.34 ERA) ... Has pitched at least six innings in eight out of his last 10 starts ... Began the year in Extended Spring Training before joining the Augusta GreenJackets (Low-A) on May 20 ... Made three starts with Augusta and compiled a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) and a 1-1 record ... Struck out a career-high 10 over seven innings versus Asheville on May 27 ... Added to San Jose's roster on June 8.

CAREER... Left-handed pitcher is in his fourth season in the San Francisco organization and second campaign with the San Jose Giants ... Has been a part of two league championship teams (San Jose 2007, Salem-Keizer 2006) ... Owns a career record of 20-17 and a 3.88 ERA over 79 appearances (51 starts) ... Originally selected in the 47th round of the 2002 draft by the Texas Rangers, but did not sign.

2008... Spent the entire season with Connecticut (AA) and was 3-2 with a 4.58 ERA in 19 games (eight starts) ... Began the year in the Defenders starting rotation and was 1-2 with a 4.80 ERA in seven starts before moving to the bullpen ... Made just one start after June 17 ... Compiled a 3.68 ERA in 11 relief appearances (5.14 ERA in eight starts) ... Struck out 45 and walked 29 over 57 innings ... **2007...** Won San Jose's Pitcher of the Year award after compiling a 10-6 record and a 3.54 ERA in 27 appearances (26 starts) with the Giants ... Finished fourth in the California League in ERA and fifth in strikeouts ... Fanned 132 and issued just 35 walks in 157 2/3 innings ... Has a string of 12 consecutive starts from May 25 through July 27 with at least six innings pitched in each appearance ... Best month of the season was in July (2.31 ERA) ... Walked only four left-handed batters in 156 at-bats ... Started the opening game of the North Division Series and the Championship Series ... **2006...** Pitched exclusively out of the Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) bullpen ... Was 2-1 with a 3.72 ERA and two saves over 16 relief appearances ... Struck out 39 and walked only nine over 29 innings ... Did not allow a run in last eight outings (17 2/3 IP).

PERSONAL... Attended UCLA ... Enjoyed a standout final collegiate season in 2006 posting a 1.66 ERA in 48 2/3 innings over 29 relief appearances ... Compiled a 3-1 record with nine walks and 47 strikeouts ... Pitched in only six games as a redshirt sophomore in 2005 (1-0, 8.10 ERA) ... Did not pitch in first two years (2003 and 2004) due to various injuries ... Established school single-season and career records for strikeouts at La Costa Canyon High School, but was limited to DH duties as a senior due to an arm injury ... Underwent Tommy John Surgery on left elbow in addition to surgery to repair a torn labrum during amateur career... Selected as the top 16-year in the country in 2000 by *Baseball America*.

- * Shortstop returned to San Jose from Connecticut (AA) on May 7.
- * Was batting .171 with one double, no home runs and three RBI's in 25 games for the Defenders.
- * Was San Francisco's opening day shortstop in 2008 and hit .143 (11-for-77) in 32 games.
- * Batted .220 with four homers, 37 RBI's and 15 steals as the everyday shortstop in '07 with SJ.
- * Selected in the 9th round of the 2006 draft. Attended Stetson University.

#14 Darren Ford (.280, 7 HR, 44 RBI)

- * Outfielder returns to San Jose after finishing the 2008 season with the Giants.
- * Worked as a switch-hitter for the first time in career during first half, but batting only right-handed since AS break.
- * Batted .219 with no home runs, seven RBI's and 14 steals in 38 games last year with San Jose.
- * Acquired via trade from the Milwaukee Brewers along with Steve Hammond on July 20, 2008 for Ray Durham.
- * Recognized as the "fastest baserunner" and "best defensive outfielder" in the Giants farm system by BA.

#34 Conor Gillaspie (.286, 3 HR, 57 RBI)

Current Streak: 11 games

- * Third baseman is rated the #7 prospect in the organization according to *Baseball America*.
- * Became the first player from the 2008 draft to reach the major leagues when he debuted last Sept.
- * Hit .268 in 18 games with S-K before appearing in eight games with the SF Giants (1-for-5).
- * Currently the youngest player on San Francisco's 40-man roster (21 years old).
- * Selected in the supplemental first round (37th overall pick) of the 2008 draft. Attended Wichita State.
